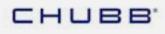
































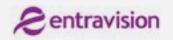

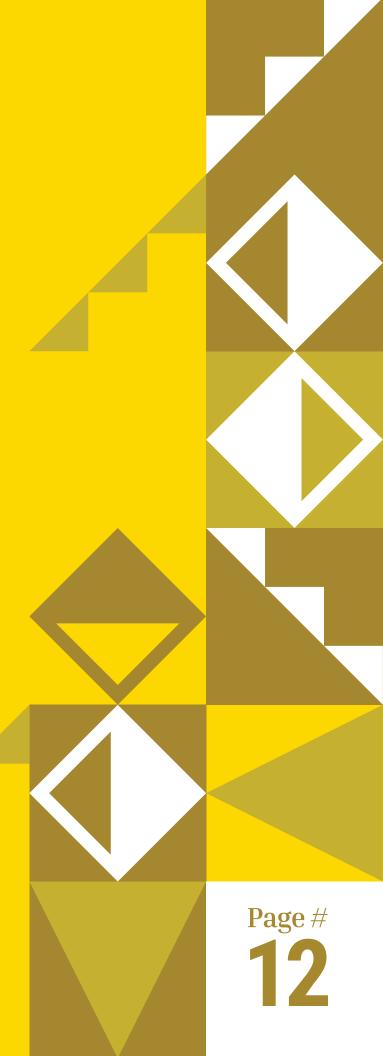

ABC Meeting with Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC) - regarding the 25% disallowance of sales promotion and advertisement expenses

24th June 2024

June 2024, the Pakistan Government introduced its budget for the next fiscal year, proposing a 25% disallowance on sales promotion, advertisement, and publicity expenses for multinational corporations (MNCs) that pay royalties to associated entities.

Before budget finalization, Mondelēz and ABC have been actively engaging with relevant stakeholders, the U.S. Embassy, and the Pakistan Broadcasters Association (PBA). Building Resilience For a Sustainable Future

As a total beverage company, we are driven by our purpose to refresh the world and make a difference. We aim to grow our business in ways that drive positive change and build a more sustainable future for our planet. We continue to focus on improving water security in high-risk locations, reducing packaging waste, decreasing emissions, and creating social impact.

Addressing Climate Change and Resilience:

We believe in taking well-informed, decisive action to help address climate challenges. The Coca-Cola Foundation (TCCF), in partnership with the USAID, WWF-Pakistan, the Ministry of Climate Change and Environmental Coordination, and the Green Climate Fund, has contributed USD 5 million to the collective investment of USD 77.8 million in the Recharge Pakistan Program. Recharge aims to mitigate flood risks and build climate resilience in vulnerable communities.

Impact:

- The Recharge Pakistan Project, a partnership between TCCF, USAID, WWF-Pakistan, the Ministry of Climate Change and Environmental Coordination, and the Green Climate Fund is expected to directly benefit more than 680,000 people and indirectly support more than 7 million.
- · The Project aims to reduce flood extent by 50,800 hectares and capture an estimated 20 million cubic meters of water.

Reducing Packaging Waste

In 2024, Coca-Cola Pakistan in partnership with the Government of Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) announced their two-year-long partnership for the Plastic-Free Gilgit-Baltistan Program. With a contribution of over PKR 30 million, we planned to install two waste crushing and baling facilities in the Shigar and Ghizer Districts in the region. In 2024, we inaugurated the first facility in Shigar City, a gateway to the Karakoram Mountain range at the foothills of the world's second tallest mountain, K-2. The second such facility will become operational during 2025. Coca-Cola is also supporting the Government of G-B to set up waste collection points and for a robust awareness campaign. Coca-Cola also organized a collection drive on the trek to the scenic Upper Kachura Lake, which helped gather waste strewn around and encouraged local shopkeepers and businesses to dispose of waste responsibly.

Impact:

- All communities of Shigar and Ghizer Districts in particular and G-B in general will benefit from the 2-waste crushing and baling facilities
- · Waste Collection Points at various locations in G-B and public outreach campaign will benefit communities and tourists.
- · The Awareness Campaign about sustainable tourism practices will help save the ecology of the region.



Prioritizing Water Replenishment

In Pakistan, one of our most impactful initiatives is the solar-powered water filtration plant in Megwarh Village in Thar. Previously, women in the area had to walk five kilometers each day to fetch water. With the new facility, they now have access to 1,000 liters of clean water per hour. In 2024, The Coca-Cola Foundation also partnered with charity: water, a non-profit organization bringing clean and safe water to people around the world, to launch a transformative clean water project in Balochistan, Pakistan's most arid and water-starved province. Additionally, the Ravi River Restoration Project in Lahore The Ravi River Restoration Project, funded by The Coca-Cola Foundation in partnership with WWF-Pakistan, is replenishing water through a combination of interventions. These include rainwater harvesting systems, recharge wells, floating treatment wetlands, ablution water reuse systems, water-efficient fixtures, and on-farm water management practices.

Impact:

- One Solar-Powered Water Filtration Plant in Thar benefits 8,000 households. Coca-Cola has established more than 55 such water filtration plants across the country.
- The Coca-Cola Foundation in partnership with charity: water aims to support 372 new and rehabilitated community water points to ensure access to clean and safe water for more than 3,500 people of Balochistan.
- The Ravi River Restoration Project, in partnership with WWF-Pakistan is replenishing water through over 40 infrastructure improvements, including rainwater harvesting systems and water-efficient technologies.

Investing in Communities

In 2024, The Coca-Cola Foundation announced a new project for financial empowerment of Pakistan's home chefs. TCCF has partnered with CARE International for this by giving it a grant for this two-year project. Care will use this grant to implement a project that will enable women across the country to enhance their culinary skills and transition into professional home chefs with small home-based businesses. This will help thousands of women increase their household income and strengthen their social status in their families and communities. The Project will develop business acumen for these home chefs through specialized business training and linkages with digital platforms. Home Chefs will not only be able to formalize but also scale-up their entrepreneurial ventures through this capacity building. According to estimates, Pakistan has 2 million women who can transform their home cooking into commercial ventures; but in most cases their potential remains untapped due to a lack of resources and skills. This Project will also train home chefs on financial management, digital literacy, and sustainable business practices, empowering women to think like CEOs in an expanding market.

During 2024, Coca-Cola Pakistan with Rizq, a local non-profit organization will continue their shared vision of a hunger-free Pakistan for the fourth consecutive year. Coca-Cola Pakistan also made it easier for the consumers to contribute to the cause with their 'Buy One Donate One' campaign which they can do simply by scanning the Donation QR code, available on Coca-Cola's bottles.

Impact:

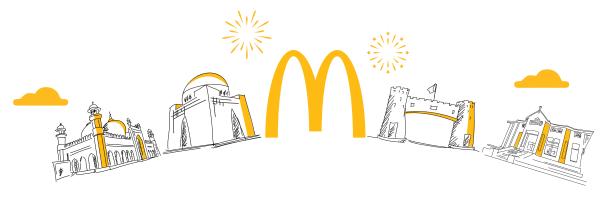
